Code and Title of Specialty (Program): 060201– Philology

1. General Provisions

1.1. The Master's degree level Education Program in the specialty **060201– Philology** has been prepared in accordance with the Law of the Republic of Azerbaijan “On Education,” the "State Standard and Curriculum of the Higher Education Level" approved by the relevant decisions of the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Azerbaijan, the “Rules on the Content, Organization of Master's Education and Awarding of ‘Master’ Degrees,” the "Classification of Specialties (Specializations) at the Master’s Level of Higher Education," and other legal regulations.

1.2. Regardless of subordination, form of ownership, or organizational-legal form, all higher education institutions operating in the Republic of Azerbaijan shall carry out master’s level education in the specialty **060201– Philology** in accordance with this Education Program.

3. Graduate's Specialty Characteristics and Competencies

3.1. Specialty Characteristics of the Master's Student

A graduate holding a master's degree must possess a broad understanding of theoretical principles and research methods, be prepared to carry out research and engage in pedagogical activities requiring professional training, and be capable of solving unexpected and complex problems within their professional field.

3.2. Competency Requirements for Program Graduates

3.2.1. A graduate must acquire the following General Cultural Competencies (GC):

- ability to work collaboratively (GC-1);
- ability to communicate with specialists from other fields (GC-2);
- active social mobility (GC-3);
- ability to work in the international arena (GC-4);
- legal knowledge and adherence to ethical norms (GC-5);
- ability to generate new ideas (GC-6);
- ability to work independently (GC-7);
- skills in organizing scientific research and managing a research team (GC-8);
- initiative and leadership (GC-9);
- ability to organize and plan work (GC-10).

3.2.2. The graduate must acquire the following professional competencies (PC):

In the Field of Scientific Research:

- ability to apply modeling methods based on in-depth knowledge in fundamental and computer sciences (PC-1);
- conducting scientific research and scientific investigations (PC-2);
- independently analyzing the main directions of the development of philology science from various perspectives (PC-3);
- ability to present the results of one's scientific research (PC-4);
- independently constructing a comprehensive overview of the subjects (PC-5).

In the Pedagogical Field:

- teaching Philology specialty subjects at the undergraduate level of higher education (PC-6);
- accessing current scientific and technical information in the field through electronic libraries and abstract journals (PC-7);

- transferring their knowledge to others through teaching, training, or other methods (PC-8).

In the organizational-administrative field:

- organizing the technological process in accordance with the technical parameters specified in projects related to the field of philology (PC-9);
- directly applying the results achieved in the development of philological science to the study of linguistics and literary studies (PC-10);
- applying linguistic technologies used in translation to the field of philology (PC-11);
- identifying general patterns and regularities across groups of subjects (PC-12);
- applying the latest theories in the analysis of problems in the field of philology (PC-13);
- leading scientific research activities of teams (PC-14);

- presenting and justifying problems and solutions both orally and in writing in Azerbaijani and a foreign language, and participating in relevant discussions with specialists and non-specialists (PC -19);

- taking responsibility for the strategic activity of organizations or groups (PC -21);
- acting in accordance with ethical norms in complex situations, understanding the ethical aspects and social role of personal behavior, and making well-grounded evaluations in professional and educational matters (PC -22);
- assessing personal and others' needs for lifelong learning and professional development and using effective methods for independent learning (PC-23);
- solving unexpected and complex problems within the scope of professional activity (PC-24);
- proposing and planning relevant actions and methods, and analyzing their short- and long-term consequences (PC-25).

4.1. Characteristics of Professional Activity

4.1.1. The main areas of professional activity for master's graduates in the specialty **060201 – Philology** are:

- scientific-research;
- pedagogical;
- organizational-administrative, etc.

4.1.2. Requirements for the level of training:

In the field of scientific research:

- applying advanced technologies in solving scientific, organizational, and practical issues in the study of real processes and objects in the field of philology;
- analyzing and generalizing the results of scientific research in the field of history using the achievements of science and technology, as well as the advanced practices of Azerbaijan and foreign countries;
- organizing and conducting conferences, seminars, and symposia;
- preparing and editing scientific publications.

In the pedagogical field:

- delivering lectures;
- conducting practical and seminar classes.

In the organizational-administrative field:

- organizing the activity of scientific research groups;
- evaluating the results of scientific investigations.

Higher education institutions determine elective courses in all sections in accordance with relevant competencies.

Competencies and corresponding courses for specializations are determined by higher education institutions.

4.3. Duration for Implementation of the Master's Program in the Specialty:

Total number of weeks – 94, including:

- Theoretical training – 45 weeks
- Practices (scientific-research and scientific-pedagogical) – 8 weeks
- Examination sessions – 15 weeks
- Preparation and defense of the master's thesis – 12 weeks
- Vacations – 14 weeks

5. Material-Technical Base and Human Resources

5.1. The material and technical base of the higher education institution must include classrooms, laboratories, computer labs, workshops, and other facilities equipped with relevant ICT tools necessary for conducting lessons, carrying out practical exercises, and performing scientific research in accordance with the curriculum of the **060201- Philology** specialty. Students must have access to the institution's local network, the internet, databases, electronic libraries, and search systems.

5.2. As a rule, the teaching of courses is conducted by the faculty members of the higher education institution who hold academic degrees or titles. Individuals employed at other institutions or organizations who meet these requirements may also be involved in this activity.

5.3. Scientific supervision of master's theses is generally carried out by faculty members of the higher education institution who hold academic titles or degrees, or by individuals employed at other institutions or organizations who meet these criteria.

6. Forms and Methods of the Teaching Process

6.1. Theoretical training and pedagogical preparation of master's students are conducted in the form of lectures, practical lessons, seminars, consultations, individual work, pedagogical practice, and others.

6.2. In the teaching process of master's education, oral explanations, interviews, interactive training, individual work, discussions, round table discussion method, illustrations, research activities, laboratory and practical work, and other methods may be used.

6.3. For the master's program in the **060201–Philology** specialty, scientific research and scientific-pedagogical practices are envisaged (the purpose and tasks of the practices are determined depending on the specialty). Depending on the type of practice, they may be conducted in relevant organizations or in university departments and laboratories.

7. Requirements and Evaluation for the Final State Attestation

7.1. The final state attestation consists of the defense of the master's thesis. The requirements for the content, volume, and structure of the thesis, as well as the procedures for its defense, are determined by the Ministry of Education of the Republic of Azerbaijan.

7.2. The assessment of students' knowledge is carried out based on the procedures approved by the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Azerbaijan.

7.3. As a result of the Final State Attestation, graduates are awarded the master's degree and a state-standard diploma.
