Development Strategy of the Department of Political Science and International Relations

(2025-2030)

I. Introduction

This document outlines the development priorities of the Department of Political Science and International Relations for the period of 2025–2030. The department currently offers bachelor's and master's degree programs in the following disciplines:

- Political Science
- International Relations
- Regional Studies

The main objective of this strategy is to improve the quality of teaching, strengthen scientific research activity, better prepare students for the labor market, and promote international academic integration.

II. Strategic Development Areas

1. Enhancement of Teaching Quality

- **Proposed updates to course content**: Inclusion of subjects aligned with labor market demands (e.g., analytical skills, research methodology, statistical software, academic writing and presentation skills).
- **Diversified teaching methods**: Expansion of seminar-style, analytical discussion, presentation, and case study sessions.
- **Language proficiency**: Implementation of additional training programs aimed at strengthening students' academic English (including terminology and writing).

2. Expansion of Research Activity

- **Research encouragement**: Support for faculty and graduate students to publish in local and international academic journals.
- **Scientific events**: Organization of regular seminars and conferences at the departmental and faculty level.
- **Strengthening Student Scientific Societies**: Engagement of students in basic research projects under the guidance of academic staff.

3. Capacity Building of Academic Staff

- **Development of early-career academics**: Transparent selection and motivation mechanisms to attract promising graduates from master's and doctoral programs into academia.
- **Professional development**: Annual participation of faculty in capacity-building and pedagogical training programs.
- **Increase in academic qualification levels**: Encouragement of advanced academic degrees among teaching staff.

4. International Relations and Academic Collaboration

- **Institutional partnerships**: Establishing cooperation agreements with regional universities and research institutions.
- **Mobility programs**: Facilitating participation in programs such as Erasmus+ and Mevlana through collaboration with university administration.
- **Virtual academic activities**: Promoting faculty and student participation in online webinars and international conferences.

5. Internships and Career Preparation

- **Professional placements**: Expanding internship opportunities with institutions such as the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, local municipalities, NGOs, and think tanks.
- Career support: Organizing workshops on CV writing, interview techniques, and career planning.
 - **Graduate tracking**: Establishing a feedback mechanism through analysis of graduate career paths.

6. Digital Infrastructure and Educational Resources

- **Expansion of digital resources**: Uploading and managing educational content on platforms such as Moodle or Google Classroom.
- Access to academic databases: Providing students and faculty with access to scholarly databases (e.g., JSTOR, Scopus, EBSCO).
- **ICT training**: Offering training on research software and tools (SPSS, Zotero, MS Excel, NVivo).

III. Monitoring and Evaluation

At the end of each academic year:

- Student satisfaction surveys on teaching quality will be conducted.
- Publication and research project statistics will be compiled.
- Participation of faculty in professional development will be assessed.
- Employment outcomes of graduates will be analyzed in collaboration with the university's Career Center.

IV. Conclusion

This strategy has been developed based on the department's existing capabilities and current academic challenges. Its implementation is expected to result in:

- More content-rich and practice-oriented degree programs,
- A more research-active academic staff,
- Graduates equipped with relevant knowledge and practical skills,
- Realization of both domestic and international collaboration opportunities.
