1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

This document was prepared in accordance with the state standard and program of Higher Education, the rules for the content and organization of Bachelor s, master's and doctoral studies and other regulatory documents.

The rules determine the general requirements for the content and конструкция of the working curriculum (syllabus), its compilation and approval process for each subject taught by the teaching staff of Western Caspian University.

Syllabus is a document that reflects the description and purpose of the subject being taught, the teaching methods used, the expected teaching results and the evaluation учи corresponding to it.

Syllabus is prepared in all subjects taught at The Bachelor's, master's and doctoral levels. Syllabus defines the requirements of teachers and the obligations of students in the educational process for each specific subject.

The purpose of teaching the subject, the methods to be applied in teaching the subject are interpreted in writing. By studying this subject, it is noted what students will know, what they will achieve and what habits they will acquire.

Training results of the discipline

The expected learning outcomes in accordance with the objectives of the subject, i. e. what the learner knows, understands and what skills he will acquire when he finishes the learning process, are noted.

Academic honesty

Evaluation:

- freelance work (0-10 points),

- attendance (0 - 10 points)

Intermediate assessment - is the assessment of the end-of-semester exams (0-50 points).

Workshop and colloquium

Colloquiums are organized 3 times each semester in accordance with the academic calendar. Each colloquium is rated at 0 - 10 points. Holding a colloquium is managed by mandalay. A student who does not participate in the colloquium is credited with 0 points.

Freelance jobs:

Required writing rules for внештатный work

Font and size: Arial 12 pt

Inter-line interval: 1.5

Total volume of work: minimum of 3 pages

Deadline for submission: 2 недели before the end of the semester.

Sustainability:

10 points are deducted for each меню непринятые 1% of the hours devoted to teaching the subject during the semester. Students who miss more than 25% of classes in the subject are not allowed to take the exam.

Exam:

Syllabus is prepared in the language in which the subject is taught students must familiarize themselves with syllabus on the first day of the lesson, and at the beginning of each semester, syllabus is added to the electronic attendance Journal.
