III. DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF THE SUBJECT:

DESCRIPTION OF THE SUBJECT: This subject examines the theoretical foundations and methods of economic regulation.

FƏNNİN MƏQSƏDİ:

By the end of the course, students should be able to:

1. Acquire knowledge in the field of economic regulation.
2. Identify the role of the state in economic management.
3. Understand the interrelations within the economy.
4. Learn the methods of economic regulation and their characteristic features.
5. Study the methodology for organizing structural policy in economic regulation.
6. Apply the acquired knowledge in practice.

Form of Course Delivery (Teaching Methods and Approaches):

1. Lecture
2. Topic discussion and debate
3. Seminars and colloquiums

Assessment Method:

1. Consultation hours are organized before the exam.
2. Exams and interim assessments (colloquiums) are conducted in written form.
3. Issues related to students' admission to exams and interim assessments are resolved by the faculty dean. Exams and interim assessments are conducted in accordance with the "Regulations on the Organization of Education with a Credit System at the Bachelor's and Master's Levels in Higher Education Institutions," approved by the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Azerbaijan on December 24, 2013, No. 348.
4. During the semester, each student must complete one independent assignment. The topics of independent assignments cover the material studied. Each independent assignment is graded on a 10-point scale.
5. The topic of the independent assignment is assigned to the student by the instructor no later than the second week of each semester, and it must be submitted no later than two weeks before the end of the respective semester.

IV. GENERAL RULES:

1. ATTENDANCE: A student who does not attend more than 25% of all hours allocated for the subject will not be allowed to take the exam..

2. Grading Rules:

The maximum total score is 100 points.

1. The maximum score accumulated during the semester is 50 points:
 - Maximum 10 points for class attendance
 - Maximum 10 points for students' independent work

- Maximum 30 points for activity in seminar sessions

In seminar classes, a student's points for this part of the course are calculated only if the student has at least 3 grades recorded in the journal. Otherwise, no points are given.

For each subject, each student is assigned one independent task during the semester. These tasks can be in various forms (problem-solving or practical assignments related to lecture topics, exercises, case studies, etc.). The instructor teaching the course determines these tasks.

Completing the task is graded with up to 10 points. The checking and acceptance of these tasks are carried out by the instructor outside of class hours.

2. Maximum score based on exam results – 50 points

The student must score at least 17 points on the exam.

3. Students who accumulate more than 50 points in total from the semester and the exam results are considered to have passed the course.
